

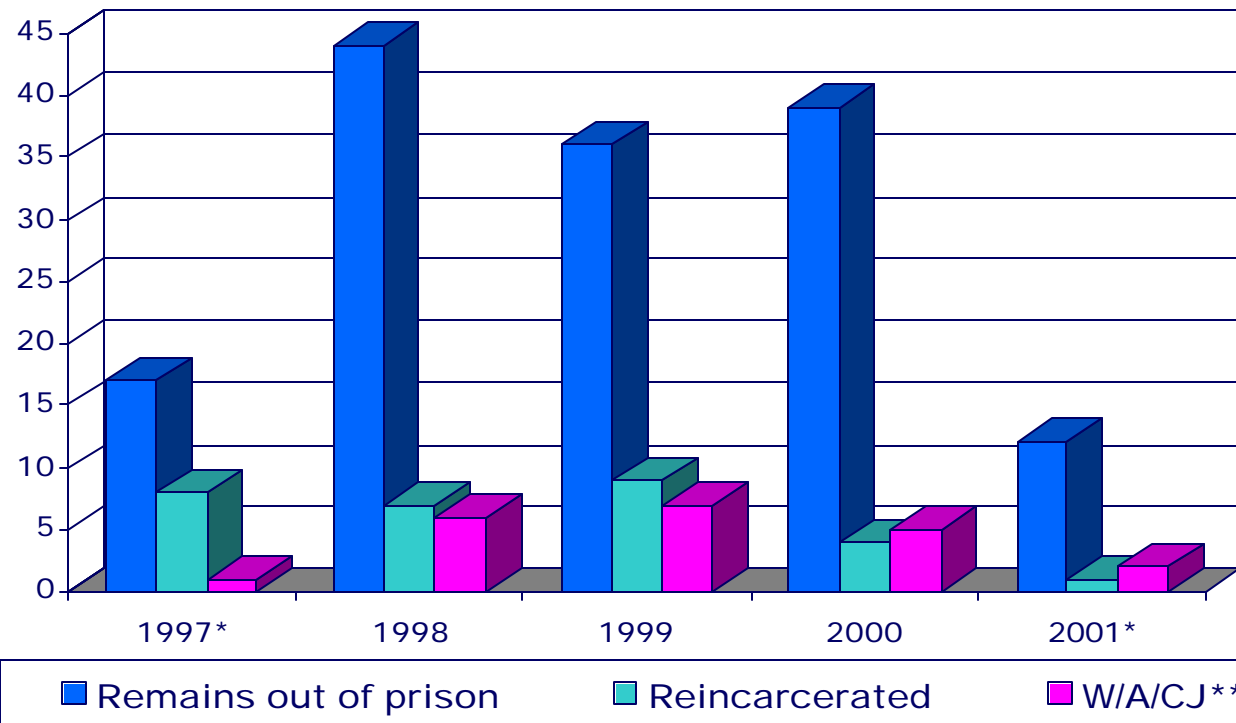
# Powder River Alcohol & Drug Program (PRAD)

# Summary of PRAD Graduate Statistics

June 1997-May 2001



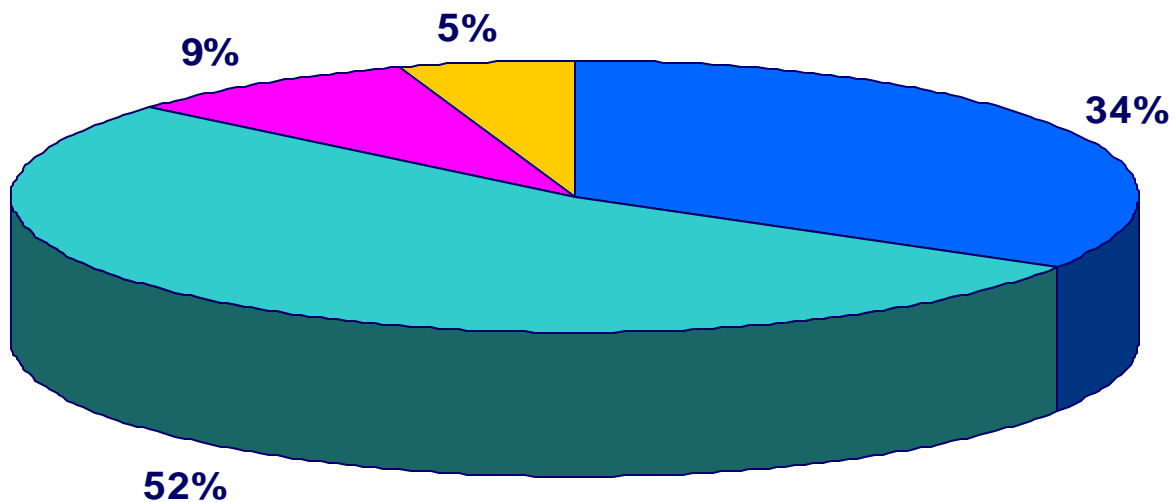
\* 1997 statistics are only from June to Dec. and 2001 are from Jan. to May.

\*\* W/A/CJ: Graduate(s) currently have a warrant, have absconded, or are in county jail.

- ☞ Average number of months graduates who are reincarcerated remained out of prison: 17.86
- ☞ Average number of months graduates remained out of prison before W/A/CJ: 19.19.
- ☞ Statistics are compiled from Dept. of Corrections and Community Corrections on-going parole officer and aftercare provider reports.

# Termination Type of PRAD Residents

June 1997-May 2001



- A total of 525 people were enrolled in the PRAD program from June 1997 to May 2001.
- 177 of the 525 have graduated from the program during this time.
- Of the 177 graduates, 148 remain out of prison.

# Conclusions

(What does this mean to the Citizens of Oregon):



- ☞ An active addicted criminal costs society **\$60,000** per year in social services, law enforcement, court costs, insurance replacement payments, etc. (Criminal Justice Institute, Inc. 1998)
- ☞ Successful PRAD graduates are no longer active addict criminals, saving the Oregon communities they live in **\$8,880,000** per year.
- ☞ The cost of the PRAD Program over this same period of time is \$3,140,000.
- ☞ **To Summarize:**
  - ➔ **\$3,140,000 Cost**
  - ➔ **\$8,880,000 Benefit**
  - ➔ **\$5,740,000 Net Savings to Oregon Communities**

...or 148 new Tax-payers vs. Tax-takers!
